NEW JERSEY FACT SHEET

- Facility in operation in existing location for more than 165 years.
- Represented by United Steelworkers (USW) Local 9404, which ratified a new four-year contract in July 2022.
- Currently employs 238 team members, who in 2024 produced and shipped more than 55,000 tons of 3-inch to 24-inch Ductile iron pipe for water systems and infrastructure.
- Primary market is Northeast U.S. and U.S. Eastern Seaboard to the Carolinas, but Ductile iron pipe produced at the New Jersey plant is shipped across North America, in particular 3-inch and 4-inch pipes. Only Ductile iron pipe producer in Northeast U.S.



ECONOMICS

- Sales volume continues to trend at record levels with projected increase following the passage of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA).
- Average \$6.5 million in annual capital investment.

ECONOMIC IMPACT

- On average over the past five years, purchased approximately \$25 million of scrap metal annually in the region, making McWane Ductile New Jersey one of the top recyclers in Northeast U.S.
- More than \$20 million in total payroll.
- \$22 million+ in expenditures with a high percentage locally for a wide range of services / goods. Key suppliers are industrial contractors, machine shops are equipment / parts original equipment manufacturers (OEMs).
- Averaged approximately \$1.8 million in power and \$1.7 million in natural gas spend annually over the past five years.
- Over \$65 million in annual economic impact.

COMMUNITY

- Through the McWane Ductile Community Advisory Panel (CAP), which consists of plant management, local elected officials, and civic and community representatives:
 - Approximately \$1.5 million in philanthropic outreach has been provided since the CAP was formed, including scholarships for Phillipsburg High School graduates and Warren County Technical College students.
- Contribute an average of \$105,000 per year to support Phillipsburg organizations through and in addition to the funding allocated by the CAP.
- Worked with City of Phillipsburg on infrastructure projects such as rebuilding Main Street and repaving Sitgreeves Street, as well as upgrades to community parks and the Heritage Walkway.
- Donated \$1 million to anchor Cal Ripken, Sr. Foundation Youth Development Park Project in Phillipsburg Community
